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12 Russian Sentence Patterns

These example sentences use the most common and basic grammar patterns for beginners. There are 3 sentences per pattern. Write them out to get used to the patterns. If you want to master Grammar in more detail, [get a Russian Textbook on Amazon](#).

Subject Verb Object

I read a book. - Я читаю книгу. - Ya chitayu knigu.



He eats an apple. - Он ест яблоко. - On yest yabloko.



She sees the cat. - Она видит кота. - Ona vidit kota.

**Present Tense**

I read. - Я читаю. - Ya chitayu.



He eats. - Он ест. - On yest.



She sees. - Она видит. - Ona vidit.



Past Tense



I read. - Я читал. - Ya chital.



He ate. - Он ел. - On yel.



She saw. - Она видела. - Ona videla.



Present Continuous

I am reading. - Я читаю сейчас. - Ya chitayu seychas.



He is eating. - Он ест сейчас. - On yest seychas.



She is seeing. - Она видит сейчас. - Ona vidit seychas.



Questions

Do you read? - Ты читаешь? - Ty chitaesh'?



Does he eat? - Он ест? - On yest?



Does she see? - Она видит? - Она vidit?



Saying you like something

I like the book. - Мне нравится книга. - Мне nraivitsya kniga.



I like the apple. - Мне нравится яблоко. - Мне nraivitsya yabloko.



I like the cat. - Мне нравится кот. - Мне nraivitsya kot.



Saying you don't like something

I don't like the book. - Мне не нравится книга. - Мне ne nraivitsya kniga.



I don't like the apple. - Мне не нравится яблоко. - Мне ne nraivitsya yabloko.



I don't like the cat. - Мне не нравится кот. - Мне ne nraivitsya kot.



Negative Statements

I do not read. - Я не читаю. - Ya ne chitayu.



He does not eat. - Он не ест. - On ne yest.



She does not see. - Она не видит. - Она ne vidit.



If-Then Statements

If I read, I learn. - Если я читаю, я учусь. - Yesli ya chitayu, ya uchus'.



If he eats, he is happy. - Если он ест, он счастлив. - Yesli on yest, on schastliv.



If she sees, she knows. - Если она видит, она знает. - Yesli ona vidit, ona znayet.



Saying you need to do something

I need to read. - Мне нужно читать. - Mne nuzhno chitat'.



He needs to eat. - Ему нужно есть. - Yemu nuzhno yest'.



She needs to see. - Ей нужно видеть. - Yey nuzhno videt'.



Asking where something is

Where is the book? - Где книга? - Gde kniga?



Where is the apple? - Где яблоко? - Gde yabloko?



Where is the cat? - Где кот? - Gde kot?

My book. - Моя книга. - Moya kniga.
