## Danish

These example sentences use the most common and basic grammar patterns for beginners. There are 3 sentences per pattern. Write them out to get used to the patterns.

## 1. Present tense verbs/actions

I eat.

Jeg spiser.




She reads.

Hun læser.




He laughs.

Han griner.




## 2. Past tense actions/verbs

I ate.

Jeg spiste.



He played.

Han spillede.



They drank.

De drak.



### 3. Talking about the future

I will eat.

Jeg vil spise.



You will play.

Du spiller.



It will rain.

Det vil regne.



### 4. Present continuous. Ongoing action.

I am running.

Jeg løber.



She is singing.

Hun synger.



They are laughing.

De griner.



### 5. Past Continuous. Action that was ongoing in the past.

I was sleeping.

Jeg sov.



He was eating.

Han spiste.



They were cooking.

De lavede mad.



## 6. Saying what you're able to do

I am able to swim.	Jeg er i stand til at svømme.
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She can understand.	Hun kan forstå.
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He can speak English.	Han kan tale engelsk.
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## 7. Comparing things/comparatives

I am taller than him.	Jeg er højere end ham.
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She is smarter than me.	Hun er smartere end mig.
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Apples are juicier than pears.	Æbler er saftigere end pærer.
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## 8. If/then statements

If it rains, I'll stay.	Hvis det regner, bliver jeg.
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If she calls, tell me.	Hvis hun ringer, fortæl mig det.
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If you help, I'll be happy.	Hvis du hjælper, bliver jeg glad.
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## 9. Passive Voice

The ball was kicked by him. Bolden blev sparket af ham.



The cake was baked by her. Kagen blev bagt af hende.



The book was read by me. Bogen blev læst af mig.



### 10. Saying what you like

I like swimming. Jeg kan lide at svømme.



You like to read. Du kan godt lide at læse.



They like to travel. De kan godt lide at rejse.



### 11. Saying what you don't like

I don't like broccoli. Jeg kan ikke lide broccoli.

She doesn't like to read. Hun kan ikke lide at læse.

They don't like music. De kan ikke lide musik.

Han sover ikke.



She does not laugh.

I need to learn English.

I must sleep.

Jeg må sove.
